Dear Navan Babbar

As you may be aware that all the centrally funded schemes are to be brought on Aadhaar based DBT. These include child oriented schemes such as ICDS, Sarv Shiksha Abhiyan, Mid Day Meal. In view of this, it is important to enroll all the beneficiaries so that no one is denied of benefits for lack of Aadhaar. While the overall Aadhaar saturation of the country as on 30th November 2016 is 84.8%, the saturation of population below 5 years and 5-18 years age stand at 32.3% and 70% respectively. Thus, special emphasis is needed on enrolment of children.

As you may be aware, the "Aadhaar (Targeted Delivery of Financial and Other Subsidies, Benefits and Services) Act, 2016" has come into effect from 12th September, 2016 and a notification to this effect has been published in the official gazette. To give effect to the provisions of the Act, UIDAI has approved Regulations under the Act and notified the same in the official gazette. Section 7 of the Act empowers the government departments to use Aadhaar as identifier for delivery of subsidy/benefit/services to the residents. Many central government departments are in the process of notifying use of Aadhaar as identifier for delivery of subsidy/benefit/services provided by them. Thus, it is pertinent that each individual is issued Aadhaar ontime.

Thus, the state government can proactively take necessary measures for enrolling the balance population of the state. In this regard, the state/UT governments have been apprised of strategies to be adopted for enrolling balance population, including children, from time to time. These include procurement of enrolment kits by the states, enrolment camps in anganwadis and schools, Aadhaar Linked Birth Registration, utilization of existing IT infrastructure in the state for Aadhaar enrolment, facilitating non-state registrars to open Permanent Enrolment Center (PECs), use of enrolment kits of the office of Registrar General of India by the states covered by NPR. I am enclosing herewith copies of three of such letters dated 22nd July, 2016, 19th August 2016 and 5th September 2016 for your reference.


